Our community has had a very positive start to the school year and we look forward to a fantastic year of learning. From Prep to Year 6, students have quickly settled into routine. School gates open at 8:30am, just in time for brekkie club, which is available to <u>every student</u>, <u>every day</u>. At 8:50am, music will play to signal our 'Ready to Learn 'program, which starts the school day in each classroom.

All classroom learning spaces focus on Literacy, Numeracy, Science, Humanities and Digital Technology, with Investigations located within the Library and available for students in Prep to participate in weekly. In every class, our teachers provide enabling and extending prompts within the lessons they teach to support and enhance student learning. This allows for all students to access the curriculum at their point of readiness, to learn, grow and excel at their individual learning pace.

All grades continue to implement our school wide Values Education and Positive Behaviours for Learning program that focuses on making positive choices and developing important skills to take charge of our learning. Classroom discussions about our school values and classroom expectations have taken place and are posted in classrooms. At the forefront of this is our school values Be Safe, Be Respectful and Be Your Best. All members of the school community, including our students, staff and families are expected to abide by these values. Our values support the positive journey our school community is on, one where Wallaroo PS is acknowledged as a well-loved place to learn, work and grow.

Students will continue to receive a *School Values ticket* when they are observed displaying one or more of our values. These tickets can be used to purchase items at our Values Shop! All School Values tickets will be collected once spent and placed in our School Values display box. As this display box fills up, the whole school is rewarded with fun activities. When the School Values display box is completely full, everyone will participate in a special event, last year we all enjoyed a fun day out and lunch at an indoor play centre. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- ⇒ **new student enrolments**; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
