


Year 1/2 CA

This year at Wallaroo, we've embraced a new whole school instructional model in Literacy called Explicit Direct Instruction. This teaching and learning practice has strong research behind it with the aim of improving our students' retention of new knowledge through a variety of engagement techniques and regular revision. This innovative approach not only facilitates the acquisition of foundational skills but also creates mental space for higher-level skills such as reading comprehension, written composition, and problem-solving.

Explicit Direct Instruction (EDI) is characterised by highly structured, explicit teaching and constant checking of student's understanding through effective questioning. Teachers provide clear, fast paced content in smaller chunks of time, while students actively engage in practise and application through structured activities and exercises. Student participation is paramount whether it's talking, writing on their whiteboards, pair-sharing or reading with the teacher, students are actively involved in their learning every 1 minute.

In each newsletter edition, we will introduce an engagement norm that students are actively employing in every classroom. This week, we're spotlighting the "pair-share" norm:



Pair-Share - This norm provides students with the opportunity to articulate their responses to a peer in their own words when prompted by the teacher, enabling them to process information. The Wallaroo classrooms have been abuzz with deep conversations as students enthusiastically share their understanding with their partners.

Both teachers and students have embraced this new evidence-based approach with great enthusiasm, and we are excited to see the growth our students will make in their learning.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- ⇒ **new student enrolments**; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
